

Discussion Questions for Small Group



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Instructions: Listen to the Shabbat audio reading together as a small group. Have your bibles with you and read along. After listening, go through the discussion questions below.

Date: September 30 and October 1, 2023

Scripture Reading: Sept 30: Isaiah 60:1-62:5 Phil1:27-2:18 Psalm 72:1-20 Prov 24:11-12, and Oct 1: Ex 33:12-23 Isaiah 62:6-65:25 Phil 2:19-3:4 Psalm 73:1-28 Prov 24:13-14

1. Read Isaiah 60:1-2.

a. What kind of darkness do you see falling upon the earth now?

b. The glory of the LORD will rise and appear upon you and before you. How does this give you hope? What might this look like?

2. Read Isaiah 60:8-9 and compare to Jeremiah 23:7-8. What are these verses in Isaiah 60 telling us about what YHVH will do during the end of days?

3. Read Isaiah 60:18. There is much violence in America's big cities. There is much violence and terrorism in the land of Israel. What does this verse promise to us? How does this give you hope?

4. Read Isaiah 61:1-3. Speak this out as a prayer over yourself, over your small group, over your family, over your community and over all of God's remnant people.

5. Read Philippians 2:5-8. What is the character that you see in Yeshua/Jesus Christ here in this passage? How might you apply that character in your own life in a practical way?

6. Take a moment to reflect and search in your own heart. Ask the Father to reveal to you if there is any pride there. Take time repent for any pride that may be there. Then ask Him to help you become more and more a humble bond servant to Yeshua and to His people.

7. Read Philippians 2:9-11. Whenever you see the word "LORD" in all caps in the KJV bible, this is a direct reference to YHVH. What do you learn about the name and the identity of Yeshua in these verses?



8. Read Isaiah 62:6-7. What is the mandate here in these verses? Ask the LORD to put a burning passion in your heart for pray for Jerusalem. This is where Yeshua will rule and reign for 1,000 years.

9. Read Isaiah 63:1-2 and compare to Revelation 19:11-13. How are these passages similar? What are they speaking about?

10. Read Isaiah 63:2-3 and compare to Revelation 14:18-20. How are these passages similar? What are they speaking about?

11. Read Isaiah 64:5-6. What is the true condition of every human being? What does God say about our "righteous deeds"?

12. Read Philippians 3:3-4. What is the antidote, the solution that Paul shows to us here? Where do we put our confidence and faith? Where do we NOT put our confidence and faith?

13. Read Isaiah 63:18 and Isaiah 64:10-11. What has happened to the Holy Temple?

14. We listening in on a conversation here between Isaiah the prophet and Abba Father. Read Isaiah 64:8-12. What is Isaiah's plea?

15. Now we hear how the Father responds to Isaiah's plea. Read Isaiah 64:1-7. What is His answer to Isaiah? Do you see any parallels to the people today?

16. Read Isaiah 64:8-10. What is the ray of hope given here?

17. Read Philippians 3:1. What is Paul exhorting the people to do? How can you apply this to your life today?
